

# Wessendorff Middle School -Band



Dear Future Wessendorff Band Member and Parents:

We are so excited that you are thinking about joining band! Be sure that you choose "Band" as your elective choice and return your course selection sheet as soon as you can! Here are some answers to common questions about joining band.

#### What instruments can I play?

At Wessendorff our students learn to play: Flute, Oboe, Bassoon, Clarinet, Saxophone, Trumpet, French Horn, Trombone, Euphonium, Tuba, and Percussion instruments.

#### How do the classes work with so many instruments?

There is only one instrument per class! The other students in your class will all play the same instrument. So if you are going to play the French Horn, ONLY French Horn players will be in your class. If you are playing Flute, only Flute players will be in your class.

#### Who will my teacher be?

There are six Band Directors that teach for the Blue Track schools (Wessendorff, Lamar Junior High, and Lamar Consolidated High School). Each Band Director specializes in teaching specific instruments so your teacher will depend on the instrument you select. The Band Directors are: James Cook, Beth Lee, Danielle Moreno, Kris Mosely, Chandler Long, and Nick Nikolovski.

#### How do we choose our instruments?

A Band Director will spend about 15 minutes helping you pick the instrument that will be best for you! We have two goals in selecting your instrument. First, we want to help you find something that sounds fun to play. Second, we want to find an instrument that fits you well. So we will perform a few simple test to see which instruments fit you best. Some of the instruments (percussion/saxophone/tuba) have limited space and fill up fast, so be sure to come early if you want to play one of those.

#### Do we have to buy our own instruments? Are they expensive?

Some of the instruments are provided by the school (Tuba, Euphonium, French Horn, Bassoon, Oboe, Percussion) and others (Flute, Clarinet, Trumpet, Trombone), are usually rented by the students. If you are playing a school-owned instrument you will still be responsible for supplying some of the supplies, lie a brass mouthpiece and stick bag/snare sticks/marimba mallets for percussionists. Rental prices usually range from \$20-\$40 per month, but some instruments, like saxophone, can cost as much as \$60 per month.

### What do I do if my family cannot afford to rent an instrument?

We will never let a student's personal finances get in the way of them being in band. If you are unable to get the required instrument supplies, please reach out to Mr. Cook @ temps cook elected one and he will be able to assist. We have resources set aside each year to help students and families and the sooner you reach out the sooner assistance can be put in place.

I know you are all talented in many areas and have perhaps a tough choice ahead, but I hope you will consider choir so you can use your singing voice to delight your friends, family and our community with performances and funthroughout the year. We have tons of fun singing, learning, and playing inside and outside of the classroom, and I am very excited to meet and work with all of you!

What do we do in Choir? Here is an outline of what we do in choir!

#### **Dear Future Wessendorff Orchestra Members and Parents:**

I am excited that you may be interested in choosing Orchestra as your elective next year! Make sure that you choose "orchestra" when selecting your elective! Our class will never run out of space and we would love to have you!

#### What instruments can I play?

At Wessendorff our students learn to play: Violin, Viola, Cello, or Double Bass. Students will choose one instrument. We do not offer string instruments such as guitar, harp, or ukulele.

#### How do we choose our instruments?

ou can sit down with the orchestra director and try out all of the possible instruments and see which one you would be most interested in learning. A representative from a local music store will be present to help you find the best rental instrument and provide supplies necessary for the class.

#### Do we have to buy our own instruments? Are they expensive?

Most students rent their own instruments from local music stores. It is <u>not</u> recommended that students <u>purchase</u> their own instrument without consulting with the orchestra teacher first. Rental instruments usually range from \$20 - \$40 per month (this is less than the price of one meal at a nice restaurant!). Students are also responsible for purchasing supplies for their instrument.

#### What do I do if my family cannot afford to rent an instrument?

We will never let a student's personal finances get in the way of them being in orchestra. If you are unable to get the required instrument supplies, please reach out to Ms. Hartis @ tess.hartis@icisd.org and she will be able to assist.
