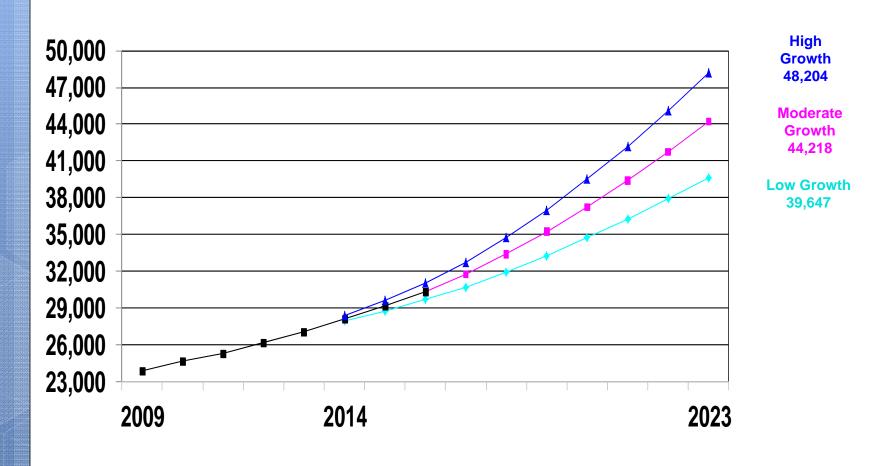

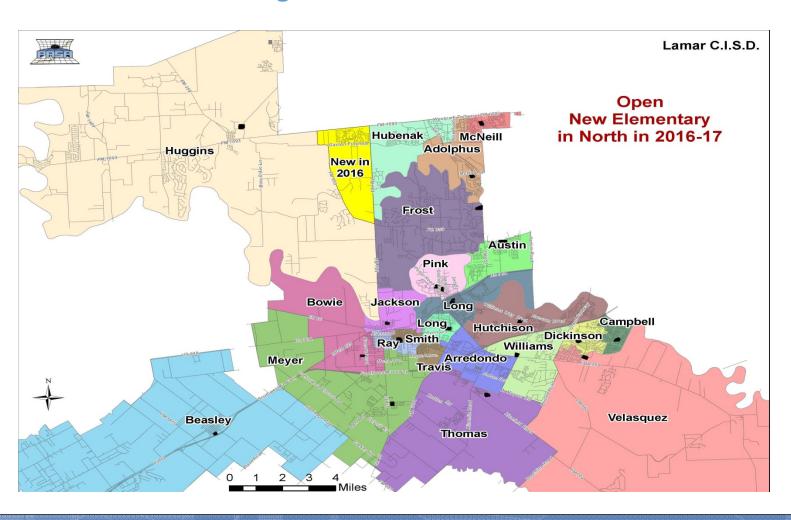

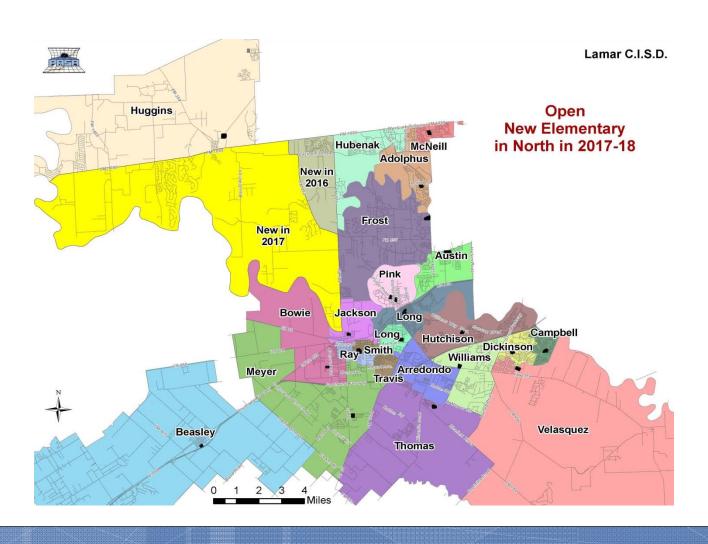
New Construction

 - 2016-17 (north)
 - 2017-18 (north)
 - 2018-19 (2)(south)
 - 2019-20 (north)
- Estimated cost: \$121,907,099

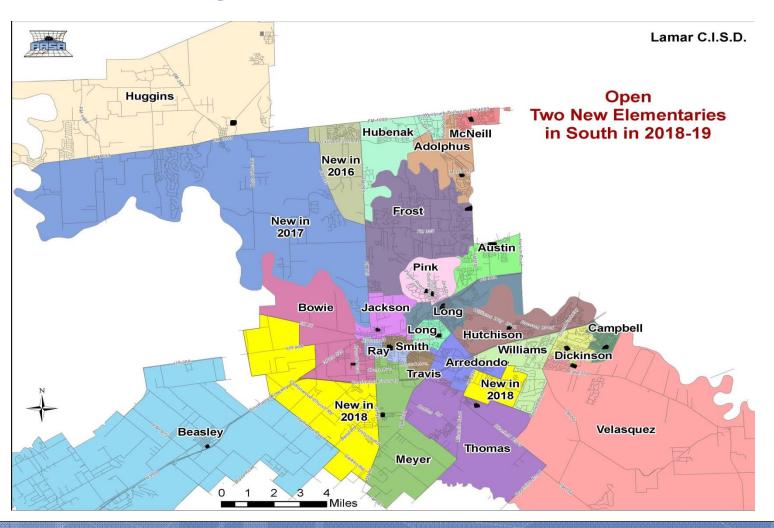
Elementary #24: 2016-17



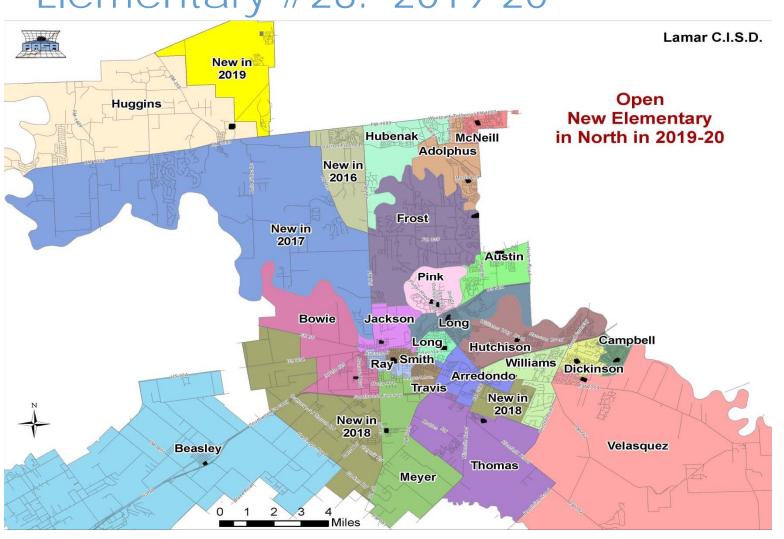
Elementary #25: 2017-18



Elementary #26 and #27: 2018-19



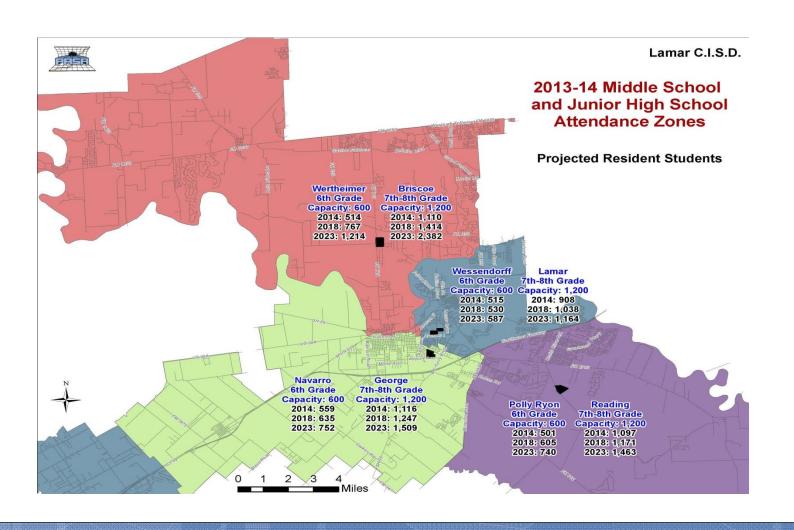
Elementary #28: 2019-20

- Opening Fall 2018
- Estimated cost: **\$22,342,493**

- Opening Fall 2018
- Estimated cost: \$3,849,077

Upgrades/New Construction – Existing Facilities: Support Services

- Needs Assessment performed by Facilities Team and other administrative personnel
- Support Services Center will serve the following departments:
 - Maintenance and Operations
 - Warehouse and Distribution
 - Property Management
 - Food Service
 - Graphic Arts
- No major improvements to the site since 1989, and very little between 1960's and 1989
 - Added 21 facilities since then (slated to add 9 more by 2023)
 - Added 15,630 students and are projected to add 13,000 more by 2023
- Solution will provide capacity for 10-15 years and will allow for expansion

Support Services Center

- Issues/Concerns:
 - All departments are at or near capacity
 - All departments are operating from multiple locations, causing inefficiencies and additional cost
 - All departments are operating with antiquated and/or dysfunctional configurations, causing inefficiencies and safety hazards
 - Food Service has inadequate conditioned space and lacks storage space for food, commodities, and paper goods
 - Graphic Arts is near capacity for equipment and lacks storage for paper/supplies
 - Warehouse/Distribution is at capacity for supplies, materials, and furniture storage
 - Property Management has inadequate space to stage items prior to auction

Support Services Center

- Ancillary Benefits gained:
 - Demolition of current configuration:
 - Maintenance additional parking for district vehicles
 - Transportation additional parking for drivers and buses
 - Traylor Stadium additional event parking
 - Development Center:
 - Expansion for technical support services and instructional technology

Other Upgrades to Existing Facilities

- Foundation repair at Pink Elementary
 - Estimated cost: \$1,056,000
- Water plant improvements at Foster High School
 - Estimated cost: \$990,000
- HVAC web-based controls (expansion)
 - Estimated cost: **\$1,056,000**

Land Requirements

- 5 sites
- Estimated cost: \$10,000,000

Technology

- Refresh of current technology
 - Estimated cost: \$10,206,020
- Instructional technology
 - Estimated cost: \$4,780,000
- Network infrastructure upgrades
 - Estimated cost: **\$3,932,500**

Food Service

- Districtwide freezer/cooler monitoring system
 - Estimated cost: \$220,000
- Secondary campus security cameras
 - Estimated cost: \$88,000
- Equipment upgrades at Lamar CHS and Lamar JHS
 - Estimated cost: \$165,000

Transportation

- Purchase of new buses
 - 33 buses for growth
 - 17 buses for replacement
 - Management of routes will still be necessary
 - Estimated cost: \$5,000,000
- Purchase of four 8-passenger vans
 - Estimated cost: \$140,000
